



LITTLE CHALFONT COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION

The Little Chalfont Community Association (LCCA) is an independent, unaligned organisation which gives members a voice in matters relating to local facilities, the environmental and general character of the village. Its aim is to ensure that Little Chalfont remains an attractive place in which to live, work and trade. The LCCA is managed by a committee of unpaid members supported by other volunteers from the community for specific activities. It is funded by annual membership subscriptions, of less than 2p a day.

The LCCA makes representations on behalf of the community, raises money locally, applies for grants that will benefit the village and undertakes a variety of activities in line with its objectives. The most visible evidence of its activities includes:

- Village Day – community focused and held annually.
- Hanging baskets and flags in the village centre.
- Most of the Christmas lights in the village centre.
- Half-yearly Newsletter containing information about all matters affecting the community.
- Small Business Saturday – an annual event to augment promotion of village shops.
- Major sponsor and driving force behind the creation of the Nature Park.
- Community Information Directory (see link at www.littlechalfont.org.uk)

Equally important is the LCCA's role as a community voice. In this capacity it can:

- Make representations for all planning matters that have wider implications for the village, including:
 - The development of Chiltern District Council's Local Plan and Green Belt Assessment.
 - Support of the proposed measures to address the ever-growing parking problems.
 - Any developments that have traffic implications for the village.
 - Working with developers to achieve the best outcomes for the community.
- Help local voluntary organisations, clubs and societies to obtain grants.
- Lobby for essential repairs and improvements in the village.

All the above benefits are effectively being subsidised by those households who are already members so we do hope that you will wish to join. The fee is very small.

Subscription Rates:	£22 for 5 YEARS	£10 for 2 YEARS	£5 for 1 YEAR.
Each subscription entitles up to two adults per household to be members. The Association's year runs from 1 January to 31 December. £22 will cover you to December 2022.
